The book provides guidance on finding the right place to live, but it's essential to do your own research as well. Some areas may be overlooked, and you should consider factors like accessibility, climate, and personal preferences. As everyone's situation is unique, this book should be used in conjunction with individual research and consideration of pros and cons. The world is facing increased instability, with economic foundations based on fiat money crumbling and global threats like earthquakes, hurricanes, and terrorism ever-present. Long-term security should be a priority over recreational pursuits. This book aims to guide readers in relocating to safer areas and developing contingency plans. Strategic Relocation focuses on finding balance between safety and living costs, considering factors like work and family ties. Author Joel Skousen, a political scientist and survivalist, shares his expertise on survival retreats, fallout shelter design, and strategic relocation. His book offers regional and state-by-state guides for safe places to live. In light of the US economy's decline, massive government debt, and monetary policy issues, it may be wise to exit the stock market and invest in tangible assets like food, ammunition, medical supplies, precious metals, and books. A survival retreat should have reliable access to water, private and secluded land, and the capability to defend against potential threats. This includes a minimum of 3 acres with suitable terrain for permaculture systems, livestock, gardens, and renewable energy sources. A well-stocked emergency kit should include a year's supply of oil and olive oil, as well as ghee, tea, instant coffee, and a Big Berkey water filter with replacement filters. A minimum of three months' worth of water should be stored in blue 55-gal drums. Additionally, invest in non-hybrid open-pollinated heirloom vegetable-fruit seeds and cooking herb seeds for at least three seasons. Aim to spend twice your monthly food budget (\$5,000) on essential items such as food-grade buckets, water barrels, a Country Living grain mill-grinder, bread maker, dehydrator, canning supplies, and a camp stove. Also consider investing in a Ruger 10/22 Take-Down Rifle with 2500 rounds of 22LR ammo, two AK-AR Personal Defense Rifles with 2000 rounds mil-surplus ammo, and a S&W M&P or Glock centerfire handgun. Don't forget to stock up on basic gunsmithing tools, high-quality knives, security cameras, and communication devices like CBs-MURs-HAM-Short Wave radios. Allocate at least \$5,000 to \$10,000 for this category. For medical emergencies, invest in first-aid supplies, 12 months of vitamins-minerals-nutraceuticals, top 50 herbs or herb formulas, and over-the-counter and prescription medications. Allocate at least \$1,000 to \$3,000 for this category. Allocate at least \$10,000 for this category. Allocate time to study and practice with at least 1200 hours of content, starting with M.D. Creekmore's "31 Days to Survival" (). Read James Wesley Rawles' "How to Survive the End of the World as We Know It" on Audible.com or physically. Then study Carla Emery's "Encyclopedia of Country Living". After reading Joel Skousen's "Strategic Relocation - North American Guide to Safe Places", which also features his video with Alex Jones, you'll likely want to relocate to the American Redoubt (Idaho-Montana-Wyoming, Eastern Oregon, and Eastern Washington). Additionally, study the American Red Cross First-Aid book, get certified in CPR and first-aid, and expect to invest around \$500-\$1000 on books. Keep your powder dry! He also underrated states like Indiana, Virginia, Iowa, and North Carolina while giving no valid reasons. The text features a map of different U.S. regions, where the author circles "recommended areas." In most cases, he simply marks the least populated areas, disregarding the underlying reasons for their low population density. As an example, in the North Central region, he circles Northern Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Michigan's Upper Peninsula, which are essentially boreal forests with poor growing conditions. Despite these issues, there is some useful information scattered throughout the book. The reviewer praises Joel Skousen's book for its in-depth analysis of safe places to live and relocation strategies, but notes some potential biases towards conservatism. They mention that while the book provides helpful insights into factors to consider when planning a hunker-down or bug-out location, not all details are reliable. The review highlights contradictions, such as the author's stance on energy shortages and China's role in them. The reviewer also expresses surprise at varying regulations across countries, particularly regarding education and immigration policies. They suggest that while socialism/communism may have originated from benevolent intentions, it often leads to corruption and poverty.
