The next step is to place the second board at the end of the 27 feet directly in front of the first board so that they mirror one another. After a Massachusetts toy manufacturer bought the rights to the game, they marketed a version of the game and called it "Faba Baga." This too varies from the modern cornhole in that it has two holes of different sizes, each worth a different size of the part of the country you're from or currently living in determines what you call the game.
